
Substantive Event: Cannabis Industry - Opportunities & Hurdles in the Distressed Horizon



IWIRC Spotlight on Justice



Being an Effective Ally

Many of our offices and firms dedicated resources and time this summer to discussing and addressing issues of structural racism and inequity. Beyond this, many people turned inward to evaluate their own positions, biases, and opportunities for allyship. In turn, books about antiracism shot to the top of bestseller lists and podcasts about race topped the charts. But what does it mean to be an ally in the workplace — and how can

you continually improve your commitment to issues of racial justice outside of those moments where the national spotlight brings it to the forefront of public

consciousness?

An ally is someone who is not a member of an underrepresented group who takes action to support that • Floodlines, The Atlantic group. It is not event-driven, nor is it work that is ever really finished. Allyship in the workplace can be difficult — • Intersectionality Matters!, but it is necessary.

- 1. Educate yourself on areas of systemic racism you do not understand. You can do this by diversifying what you read, watch, and follow.
- individuals in underrepresented groups. Let their comments inform and define your role as an ally. Bear witness to the triumphs and triggers your co-workers identify. Learn to identify behaviors you or other colleagues may have that make the workplace

2. **Listen** to individuals at the company that have taken on this work, particularly

- more challenging for them. Keep in mind that this shouldn't mean that your underrepresented colleagues always need to educate you or do the labor.
- 3. **Speak** to your colleagues who are not in underrepresented groups about these issues (and friends and family too, of course!), especially if you are in a position to use your voice to call out behavior or call someone into a conversation.
- 4. Create space for your colleagues in marginalized groups to voice their ideas, opinions and needs. And provide support for their initiatives (from the top-down and the bottom-up).
- 5. Use your voice to amplify the stories and efforts of underrepresented voices.

Tips for Staving Off the Sunday Scaries

We've all been there—Sunday night, sitting on the coach, absolutely dreading the week ahead. As we sit squarely in Fall, unable perhaps to look ahead to holiday parties, winter vacations, and other activities that would typically break up the slog, it is even more important to get the weekends right. In keeping with our aromatherapy event earlier this month, we outline some recommendations for getting rid of the Sunday Scaries for good!

- Pace the weekend effectively. Don't leave all of your weekend work or chores to the last minute. It will make things hang over your head all weekend long if you know the worst is yet to come. It can be tempting to keep the computer shut off on Saturday, but if you have a lot to do, it will only make Sunday that much worse.
- 2. **Set yourself up during the week.** Even better than not leaving all the chores until Sunday is not leaving them to the weekend at all! Take a look at regular meetings (that you have control over) and see if they can shift to later in the week or day. And schedule some things you look forward to (e.g. a check in with a mentor, a call with friends).
